Idaho Conservation Corps provides opportunities for youth and young adults to learn, grow, and experience success.

Youth Corps Community Program Description

Youth Corps Community is a 5 week long job skills training conservation day program for 15-18 years olds. Participants complete service projects in their community each day, returning home each night. Crews meet at a designated site every morning. Members spend an average of 6 hours per day on a service project and one hour doing education. During that time, crews come together not just as co-workers, but as a group of friends and teammates. They return home at the end of the day with new skills and pride in a job well done.

Benefits and Compensation

Youth earn \$1,000 for the program plus up to \$200 in bonuses and can earn 1.0 full credit of Physical Education and a .25 credit for Science. Youth also gain a job or college reference and a letter of recommendation for their hard work. In addition to earning money, youth will develop job, leadership, and safety skills.



Idaho Conservation Corps

Purpose

Idaho Conservation Corps' (ICC) purpose is to provide opportunities for youth and young adults to learn, grow, and experience success. Our programs focus on education, challenge, community, leadership and empowerment, giving youth critical life skills and confidence. ICC programs stress teamwork, inclusion, and leadership while promoting a solid work ethic and individual achievement. Youth leave ICC knowing that they can overcome obstacles, solve problems, make friends, and attain their objectives in life.



Youth Programs

Youth Corps Community

5 Week Day Program for youth ages 15-18

Earn up to \$1000 plus bonuses

Youth Corps Community is a paid job training day program for ages 15-18. It allows participants to complete service projects in their own community each day, returning home each night. Crews meet at a designated site every morning. Members spend an average of 6 hours per day on a service project and one hour doing education. During that time, crews come together not just as co-workers, but as a group of friends and teammates. They return home at the end of the day with new skills and pride in a job well done.

Youth Corps Community crews follow a 5 week M-F day crew format, accessing projects within the community they reside. Typical projects include trail maintenance, invasive weeds, tree planting, park maintenance, and fencing projects. Participants earn a stipend and school credit.

Youth Corps Camping

5 Week Camping Program for youth ages 16-18

Earn up to \$1250 plus bonuses

Youth Corps Camping programs combine education, job skill training with outdoor adventure for ages 16 to 18. With the guidance of experienced field staff, youth crew members work on conservation, reforestation, and recreation projects, while developing leadership skills and learning how to work as a team. Crews camp in the field for their entire session, traveling to a new project each week. Participants gain a sense of pride that comes with hard work and a job well done, learn to become stewards of our public lands, and develop lasting friendships.

Youth Corps Camping crews camp at their project location and are able to access remote backcountry areas. Typical projects include trail maintenance and construction, invasive weed removal, stream restoration, campground maintenance, and fencing projects. Participants earn a stipend and school credit.

AmeriCorps Programs

Idaho Service Corps

5 month program for adults ages 19-24

Through the Idaho Service Corps (ISC), receive paid job-training experience as you meet the Northwest's highest priority conservation needs, including wildfire reduction, non-native weed eradication, and trail building and maintenance. In addition to accomplishing critical work, you'll earn professional certifications needed to become part of the next generation of stewardship leaders, as well as an AmeriCorps living allowance and education award.

Seasonal Stewardship Program

8 week program for adults ages 19-26

Interested in pursuing employment with conservation corps, land and water resource management agencies, or other outdoor careers? Our Seasonal Stewardship Program (SSP) will provide you with hands-on training and experience needed to work on physically challenging conservation projects. Evenings are spent on related educational and recreational activities. Prepare to graduate with sore muscles, awesome technical skills, solid job reference, and an AmeriCorps living allowance and education award.

Resource Stewards

8 week-10 month program or adults ages 20+

Resource Stewards are placed directly with land and water management agencies and non-profit organizations around the region. Resource Stewards are tasked with accomplishing specific projects that are critical to the success of the host agency. Resource Steward positions can vary from 10 weeks to 10 months depending on the position and needs of the host site. Support elements such as housing or food can vary widely depending on location and position duties. ICC staff will work with you to determine what positions would best meet your needs and skill set. College coursework is generally required for these positions.
