IMPACT SUMMARY

Attendance & Reach

- 600 high school students grades 9–12
- 40 chaperones and teachers supporting students
- 27 Idaho high schools represented
- 25 State, college, and community partners engaged
- 21 volunteers assisting with check-in, workshops, room monitoring, logistics

Engagement & Participation

- State Elected Officials participation included Idaho's Governor, Attorney General, Controller, Superintendent of Public Instruction
- 75 students per workshop session
- 16 team leaders
- 13 interactive career and academic workshops
- 2 student and career professional panels
- 1 State of Idaho Teacher of the Year attended



Student Outcomes & Opportunities

Student participants walked away with:

- \$5.3M college reported student scholarships awarded
- 148 college reported student scholarship recipients
- Direct exposure to employers, colleges, and career professionals
- Practical skills in leadership, communication, and goal-setting

Post event student survey results:

- Overall Sentiment - Strongly positive
- 83% responded that after attending IYLS, they have a better understanding on what career to pursue in college
- Many students explicitly wrote that the summit was “enjoyable, helpful, and impactful”
- College & Career Fair received the highest impact score
