HEP Instructor/Tutors are committed to expanding educational opportunities to migrant seasonal farmworkers and their families. These part-time positions require working one-on-one and in small groups with program participants; providing instruction and academic support to help ensure GED completion.

Key Responsibilities:

• Instructor/Tutors will follow an approved curriculum and develop a syllabus for each participant or cohort. They will work to build community and enhance student engagement, combined with practice and skill-building activities tailored to individual student need. Lesson plans will address multiple critical thinking levels and learning preferences (for example, visual and auditory) to accommodate a variety of student learning needs. They will be responsive, encouraging, and innovative. The Instructor/Tutors will coordinate their efforts to ensure that all instructional activities reinforce each other. They will also be trained on the distance learning platform that students will have access to.
